Andy Warhol was the leading artist of pop art, obsessed with celebrity, comsumer culture and mechanical reproduction and silk-screen printing. He reached worldwide fame.

He stated "Art is what you can get away with" and everyone will be famous for 15 minutes.

He was known as a social radical an creative melting pot. Warhol was a practicing Ruthenian Catholic. He regularly volunteered at homeless shelters in New York City, particularly during the busier times of the year, and described himself as a religious person.
