

CHRISTOFANO ALLORI

1577 - 1621



Italian Artist

Christofano Allori was born in Florenz. He was artistically trained by his father Alessandro Allori. He joined the Florentine school wanting to separate from the cold application of colours to a more rich expression of the same. He eventually parted from his early Florentine Mannerism paintings to study nature and landscapes in depth by adhering to delicacy and technical perfection.

Christofano also created dramatic biblical paintings and portraits. His most famous work is "Judith with the Head of Holofernes."
