Marc Zakharovich Chagall was a Russian-French artist of Belarusian Jewish origin.

He painted in a mixed style between Cubism, Fauvism and Symbolism.

Cogniat wrote, "Chagall is unrivalled in this ability to give a vivid impression of explosive movement with the simplest use of colors..." Throughout his life his colors created a "vibrant atmosphere" which was based on "his own personal vision."
