PAUL GAUGUIN

1848 - 1903





French Artist

Eugène Henri Paul Gauguin painted bright and colourful experimental post-Impressionist images of mostly Tahitian Women. He also created sculptures, ceramics and engravings. He later evolved towards Cloisonnism, a method of flat areas of colour and bold outlines.

Gauguin lived for many years in Tahiti, which influenced many of his paintings.

Gauguin never received the fame of today in his lifetime, as he became popular only after his death with the help of the art dealer Ambroise Vollard.

His "Nafea Faa Ipoipo" was sold privately for US\$300 million in 2015.
