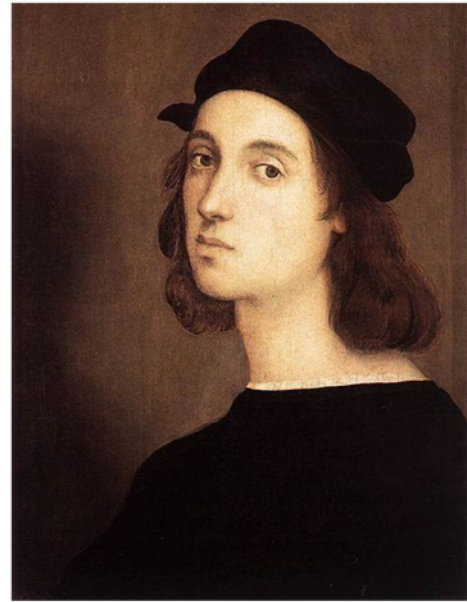

Italian Artist

Raffaello Sanzio da Urbino was of the greatest High Renaissance painters.

He became famous and was esteemed high. He received major commissions and worked mostly from Florence, which was the centre of the burgeoning renaissance.

He was acquainted with Leonardo da Vinci and Michelangelo. He was known for his supreme grace of painting, his clarity of form and his ability to convey beauty, grandeur and perfection.

He also became a noted art teacher and operated one of the largest art schools in Rome with over 50 pupils.
