Dutch Artist

Johannes, Jan or Johan Vermeer ranks amongst Rembrandt and Frans Hals as one of the most remowned of all Dutch artists during the Gold Age era, but was far less known in his own day. He concentrated almost entirely on domestic interior scenes of the middle class of his time.

He was a moderately successful provincial genre painter.

Vermeer was a master of incorporating shadow and light to his works. He was able to achieve this style by using the camera obscura.
